

Instructions for handling batteries

WARNING! Risk of explosion! Batteries may containflammable materials. When handled incorrectly, batteriesmay leak, become hot, ignite or even explode.

- Please observe the following instructions:
- Keep batteries away from children.
- Batteries may cause injury or death if swallowed. Seek medical assistanceimmediately
- if a battery is swallowed.

 Never recharge a battery that is labelled as non-rechargeable.

 Do not combine new and old batteries or batteries of different types.
- Never swap battery polarity.
- Never short-circuit batteries.
- $\bullet \ \ \text{Never expose battries to excessively warm conditions such as direct sunlight, fire or similar.}$
- Do not inflict mechanical damage on batteries (do not dismantle, deform orpierce batteries).
 If any battery fluid comes into contact with the skin or eyes, wash the affected area with water and seek medical assistance immediately,

Cleaning, maintaining and storing batteriesTo extend the working lifeof your batteries and ensure safe use, please observe the following instructions:

- If necessary, clean battery and appliance contact points before inserting.
- Remove flat batteries from the appliance immediately.
- \bullet Remove batteries from the appliance if it is not to be used for an extended period of time.
- Insulate battery contact
- points with adhesive tape before storing or disposing of batteries.

Disposal Flat batteries should not be placed in household waste! Batteries mustbe taken to an approved collection point for old batteries.



Batteries containing hazardous materials will be marked with thesymbol opposite, advising that they may not be disposed of withhousehold waste. The labels for significant heavy metals are asfollows: Cd=Cadmium, Hg=Mercury, Pb=Lead (these will be clearlymarked on the battery e.g. As pictured on the waste bin symbol on theleft).

Please dispose of appliance and batteries separately! Remove allbatteries from the battery compartment and/or remove built-in batteries from their housing. .
